To Whom It May Concern:

The Asylum Seeker Advocacy Project (ASAP) helped [NAME] fill out and review the attached pro se Employment Authorization Document (EAD) Application, Form I-765. [NAME] is a member of ASAP and is therefore eligible to apply for an EAD based on the Preliminary Injunction in *Casa de Maryland v. Wolf*, No. 8:20-cv-02118-PX (D. Md. Sep. 11, 2020).

Pursuant to the injunction, members of ASAP are NOT currently subject to parts of the rules regarding EADs that went into effect in August 2020. As such, [NAME] is eligible to request work authorization because she has more than 150 days on her Asylum EAD clock. Furthermore, she is not required to pay the \$85 biometrics fee, her application must be processed within 30 days, and her application cannot be denied as a matter of discretion.

[NAME] is currently representing herself 'pro se' in her removal proceedings. Although ASAP provided limited assistance to help [NAME] prepare this pro se application, our organization is unable to represent her for their asylum case. However, we have given [NAME] recommendations for attorneys in [STATE], and Ms. [NAME] is actively seeking full representation for herself and her minor child.
